MYRTLE BEACH, S.C. — Victor V. DeSantis, 89, of Myrtle Beach, S.C., and formerly of Northumberland, Pa., passed away on Sunday, March 30, 2014. He was a resident of the Brightwater Senior Living Community.

Vic was born in Trevorton, Pa., on August 18, 1924, a son of the late Domenico and Domenica DeSantis. On June 21, 1947, he married Mary E. (Evans) DeSantis, who preceded him in death on Oct. 11, 2006.

Vic was a 1942 graduate of Trevorton High School.

He was a veteran of WWII, serving in the European theater. He was involved in the following campaigns and battles: Normandy, the Ardennes, Central Europe, Northern France and Rhineland. He was awarded the American Theater Ribbon, the Good Conduct Medal, European-African-Middle Eastern Ribbon with one Silver Star and the Victory Medal.

Vic retired from the Celotex Corporation in Sunbury.

He was a member of St. Thomas More Catholic Church, Northumberland, and St. Monica's Catholic Church, Sunbury.

Surviving are two sons, Victor Jr. and Allyson DeSantis, of Walkersville, Md., Michael DeSantis, of Dayton, Tenn. and one daughter, Donna and Keith Wynn, of Myrtle Beach, S.C.; seven grandchildren, Angela and Joseph Earp, Jennifer and Andrew Serebrenik, Matthew and Kei DeSantis, Benjamin and Christina Wynn, Christopher DeSantis, Steven DeSantis and Jonathan DeSantis.; and seven great-grandchildren, Tyler Earp, Andrew and Olivia Serebrenik, Kousei and Jyunta DeSantis and Benjamin and McCartney Wynn.

Vic was preceded in death by his brothers and sisters, Agnes, Anthony, Isotta, Reynolds, Elizabeth and Daniel.
